“Blazing” Ahead

This is the story of a horse, one who almost didn't make it. Blaze was surrendered to us at the end of August of this year, severely undernourished, blind in one eye, and with a troubling head tilt. He was immediately put on a refeeding schedule, small quantities of alfalfa, increasing with time. He was kept in a stall the first month so his health could be monitored and so he wouldn't overeat in the pasture.

His weight was estimated at 400 lbs. and he has put on close to 200 lbs. since August. He still has a long way to go, but his head tilt has improved and he is now in a pasture full time. He has made friends with Midnight, his pasture buddy, and delights in human attention. Blaze has the hearts of all us here at KYEAC and he'll steal your heart too, as he has of all who meet him.
